## Required\*

The Foundation High School Program includes the following additional required classes:

- Health – .5 credit
- Technology – .5 credit
- Languages Other Than English – two credits
- Physical Education – one credit in JH and one credit in HS

Two Fall semesters of HS Marching Band or two semesters of Athletics fulfill the HS PE requirement.

- Students may schedule these five credits into any of the red-coded boxes to the left. Unscheduled time may be filled with additional electives.
